BOARD OF SELECTMEN ARLINGTON, VERMONT ORDINANCE NO. 71-1 SCHOOL ZONE TRAFFIC AUGUST 2, 1971

AN ORDINANCE PURSUNAT TO SECTION 1142 CHAPTER 13, TITLE 23, VERMONT STATUTES ANNOTATED TO PROVIDE FOR THE DESIGNATION AND MAINTENANCE OF A SCHOOL TRAFFIC ZONE.

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Board of Selectmen of the Town of Arlington, Bennington County, Vermont as follows:

<u>SECTION 1.</u> The road and area subject to this ordinance shall be within the bounds of the Town designated as State Aid No. 1 (East Arlington Road).

<u>SECTION 2.</u> A highway School Zone for the regulation of traffic passing the Arlington Memorial High and Fisher Elementary Schools is designated as follows:

- (a) The zone will expend 600 feet from the east driveway of the High School easterly and 600 feet from the west driveway westerly for a total length of approximately 1500 feet. Each end of the zone will be marked by a painted white line twelve (12) inches wide across the road and having permanent posted signs at each end of the line termed "SCHOOL ZONE 25 MPH".
- (b) Not less than 200 feet from the line in subsection (a), extending beyond, the road will be marked by painted white letters approximately 7 foot 6 inches high by 18 inches wide termed –

SCHOOL

SLOW

(c) Permanent posted signs at the point designated in sub-section (b) will be located termed-

SPEED 25 MPH

(d) A roadway crosswalk from the west entrance to the Highway School to the field serving the Fisher School and the Athletic Field will be marked by a painted white line 6 inches wide approximately 8 feet apart.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> A person who violates the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined \$10.00, which fine shall be paid to the Town of Arlington.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> This regulation shall become effective sixty (60) days from the date of it's adoption.
