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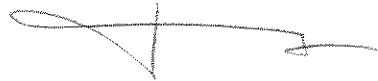

PETITION FOR NON-SUBSTANTIAL CHANGE DETERMINATION

NOW COMES T-Mobile Northeast, LLC (“T-Mobile” or Petitioner”) and petitions for a determination from the Vermont Public Utility Commission (“the Commission”) that certain modifications to the wireless telecommunications facility approved in the Certificate of Public Good issued in Case #26-0763-PET, dated June 1, 2026 (“the June 2026 CPG”) do not represent a substantial change to, or a material deviation from, the project as approved in the June, 2026 CPG, in order to allow T-Mobile to proceed with the Project at its earliest possible opportunity.

1. On June 1, 2026, the Commission granted the June 2026 CPG, and supporting Order, authorizing the placement of a generator in support of a telecommunication facility at 487 Butternut Gutter, Arlington, Vermont. As set forth in that earlier petition, T-Mobile petition sought permission to add a generator as part of the base equipment within the existing compound. The project, as approved by the June 2026 CPG, met all the requirements for a project of limited size and scope.

2. The June 2026 CPG, in paragraph 1 states, in part, as follows: “[s]ite preparation, construction, operation and maintenance of the project shall be in accordance with the plans and evidence submitted in this proceeding. Any material deviation or substantial change in the Project is prohibited without prior Commission approval.”

3. Since obtaining the June 2026 CPG, but before commencing construction of the Project approved by that CPG, T-Mobile needs to change the location of the generator inside the equipment compound, due to a request from the tower owner.

4. Specifically, T-Mobile had proposed putting the generator on the existing concrete pad on which other base equipment would also be located.

5. T-Mobile now proposes placing the generator on a separate, 4' x 9' concrete pad inside the existing fenced compound. The proposed change is shown on Sheet C-101 of the site plans submitted with this petition. This change is at the request of the tower owner. No changes are being made to the compound area or location, or to the tower or antennas.

6. This change will result in the addition of a 4' x 9' concrete pad inside the fenced compound. The amount of the impervious surface area proposed by T-Mobile for the June 2026 CPG was zero, as the existing concrete pad, at the base of the existing tower and within the existing equipment compound, was being utilized to hold the generator. Now, there will only be an additional 36 sq. ft of new impervious surface area as a result of this proposed change.

7. The only change is the addition of the small concrete pad and the new location of the generator. The project still meets all of the requirements for a de minimis project. It should be noted that no objections were filed regarding the Project prior to the issuance of the June 2026 CPG.

12. In support of this request, T-Mobile is submitting the following materials: (1) new site plans showing the new pad and new location for the generator; (2) Pre-filed testimony of Cullen Morgan in support of the petition; and (3) proposed CPG and Order. In addition, T-Mobile is submitting a certification of compliance showing service of this request on the landowner, and the municipality's Selectboard.

WHEREFORE, T-Mobile respectfully requests that the Commission issue an order finding that the proposed modifications as presented herein do not represent a substantial change to, or a material deviation from, the Project approved in case #26-0763-PET.
